TRUSTEE NOTES

The Trustees are sad to inform you that our long serving Legal Advisor, Werner G. Barthol passed away unexpectedly. Werner was an outstanding individual and an excellent attorney for Painesville Township. Werner's commitment to his family was always evident. All of us who worked with Werner admired him for his sharp legal mind and his quick wit. He was a genuinely nice person who treated everyone he came into contact with charity and respect. He always kept the welfare of the residents of Painesville Township at the forefront of his service. Werner is survived by his wife Kelly, and two daughters. He will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

The Trustees will hold a second regular business meeting out in the community this year. The Trustees hope that conducting meetings throughout the Township will encourage residents to attend a meeting and participate in the Township's business. The last meeting was held in May at the Hardy Road Fire Station and was well attended. The next meeting in the community will be held on Tuesday, October 18, at 7:30 p.m. The meeting will be at the Riverside Local School District Board Office, located at the Riverside Campus on Riverside Drive.

The expansion of the parking lot at the Hardy Road Fire Station is complete. The expansion was constructed in the spring of 2016 by Painesville Township and supported by Lake County Stormwater Management Department and Chagrin River Watershed Partners, Inc. This project was financed in part through a grant from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency under provisions of the Surface Water Improvement Fund. The surface is a "permeable surface". Permeable pavement helps developed areas behave more like natural landscapes. The permeable pavers allow stormwater runoff from the fire station's parking lot to soak into the ground, reducing downstream flooding, erosion and pollution to Red Creek, a tributary to the Grand River and Lake Erie.

How does Permeable Pavement Work?

Rain and snowmelt runoff from the asphalt parking lot drains to the pavers and passes through the spaces in between and into layers of underlying stone. The water slows down as it flows through the layers of stone, and pollutants are removed. Some of this water soaks into the ground beneath the stone, and some is slowly released to a perforated pipe underdrain that carries it to a storm ditch and eventually to Red Creek. In summer months, heated

water entering our streams directly from conventional pavement can harm aquatic life and habitat. This process slows the drainage and lowers the water's temperature.

After an extensive search, the Trustees have hired Matthew A. Lallo as the new Legal Advisor for the Township. Matt works in private practice in Willoughby. He will serve as the Legal Advisor to the Trustees, the Zoning Commission and the Board of Zoning Appeals.

The Trustees welcome Dave Novak to the Zoning Commission. Dave is a long time resident of Painesville Township. He is a Registered Professional Land Surveyor and owns his own business, the Barrington Consulting Group. Welcome aboard Dave!

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Station Improvements

Stop by Station 2 and take a look at the improvements to our firehouse. Station 2 is located at 141 Bowhall Rd. The station crews, with help from the Service Department and donations from local businesses, spruced up the inside and outside of the station. We installed some unique features, including a Koi Pond, at a very low cost.

Station 1 (55 Nye Rd) and Station 2 were built in 1966. For the most part, the buildings remain in their original condition. Over the years we have put new windows in both stations, and we are working on doors and LED lighting this year at both stations.

Station 2 is also a “Pokémon” stop, so if you do pull into the station, watch for people chasing monsters.

Vial of Life Program

At a recent trustees meeting, a resident inquired into the status of the “Vial of Life” program. The Vial of Life program is a voluntary, free program, that makes a person’s medical history, current medications, allergies and other pertinent health information available to our paramedics should you call for medical assistance. The Vial of Life information speaks for you in the event you cannot speak for yourself during a medical emergency. Our medics can quickly evaluate your medications and medical history to assist them and the medical staff at the hospital in treating a medical condition.

To participate in the Vial of Life program, the resident completes a medical information sheet, receives an empty syringe vial, a sticker, and Vial of Life magnet. The concept is to fill out the form, place the folded form in the vial and place it on the top shelf of your refrigerator, and place the magnet on the front of your refrigerator. The paramedics know where to look and see if your information is available. This system makes it easy for the medics to find your information and treat you.

We are kicking this program off at our Family Fun Day on August 27th. Forms and other associated equipment will be available at the Fire Departments display. The program will then be available at any of our fire stations and at Township Hall. We will include the Vial of Life package with the Roper box program. The Roper boxes are a secure system that provides a key to our FD responders to enter your home should you be unable to let us in. The boxes are available for \$30.00 in a hang over-the-door or mounted style.

Smoke Detectors

Please check your smoke detectors every month. Should you need help changing a battery or need a smoke detector, please call Township Hall 440-352-1443. Our Fire Department personnel will be happy to assist you. Should your detector be alarming or you don’t know why it’s making noise call 911, we will be glad to come out and check your alarm. We would rather respond to that call than respond to your house on fire. When in doubt call 911.

Crayons for Kids

A resident stopped by the firehouse this past week. She was recently a patient at Rainbow Babies and Children’s Hospital and found that they were a little short on crayons for the kids that have to stay there. This resident decided that she was going to start collecting crayons to donate to the hospital. She has a goal of 10,000 boxes by Christmas and has asked for our help. Since her drive began, she has already collected 5,000 boxes! If you would like to help, we are collecting 24-count crayon boxes which you can drop off at any of our Township fire stations. Thank you for your support!

SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The free brush, leaf and yard waste drop-off area is open on Wednesdays from 7:30 am until 3:00 pm, and on Saturdays from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm. The drop-off is behind the Service Garage. Please enter from Fairport Nursery Road. Representatives from the Service Department are there to assist residents with the drop-off.

There will once again be two curbside leaf collections this fall:
Saturday, November 12th
Saturday, December 3rd
These collections are for bagged leaves only, and brush will not be picked up. Leaves must be placed in brown recyclable bags. Loose piles and plastic bags will not be picked up.

During the month of November, the drop-off area will be open Monday through Friday from 7:30 am until 3:00 pm, and on Saturdays from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm.

Our Service Department crews continue to seal roadway cracks using a hot-applied rubber based sealant. Over 30,000 pounds of sealant will be used this summer, and 30 roads will be sealed. Crack sealing helps extend the life of a road by preventing water from entering the roadway base.

The decorative stamped concrete along the Mentor Avenue sidewalk has been cleaned and sealed to protect it from the weather and road salt. This treatment cleans and preserves the distinctive look of these sidewalks.

Our Service Department employees continue to take advantage of training opportunities. We will be attending a Green Infrastructure Maintenance class in August and a Hazardous Waste Management class in September.

This spring students from the Riverside elementary schools and high school painted decorative images on all of the Township snow plows. Three of the plows were on display at the Mardi Gras parade, and three more were on display at the Lake County Fair parade.

TOWNSHIP NOTES

The Zoning Commission is currently reviewing the updated Comprehensive Plan. Once the Commission completes their review the Plan will be submitted to the Trustees for final review. The Trustees will hold a public hearing to gather residents input. The public hearing will be posted on our website when it is scheduled.

The Township will hold its second annual document shredding day on Saturday, September 24. Residents may bring personal paper records to the Service Garage on Hardy Road from 11 am to 1 pm. This is a free service to Painesville Township residents. Gabe Cicconetti Allstate Insurance sponsors the Document Shredding Day.

The Lake County Board of Elections needs poll workers for the election on November 8. Training is provided and the Board pays \$150.00 for the day’s work. Please call the board of Elections at 440-350-2700 for information.
