The Streetscape Project has begun. The Trustees applied for a grant to build five glass-enclosed bus shelters along Mentor Avenue several years ago. The grant will pay for 100% of the cost of the bus shelters. Once the concrete pads and solar powered lights are constructed, LakeTran will build the glass-enclosed shelters and install benches. This project has been a nice collaboration between Painesville Township, Laketran, the Lake County Engineer's Office and ODOT. All work will be completed by October, just in time for the fall and winter weather!

ROAD SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The brush, leaf and yard waste drop off area is open on Saturdays from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm and on Wednesdays from 7:30 am until 3:00 pm. This service is for Painesville Township residents only and yard service contractors are not permitted. Members of the Service Department will be on hand to assist residents in unloading their vehicles.

During the month of November the drop off area will be open Monday through Friday from 7:30 am until 3:00 pm and on Saturdays from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm.

There will once again be two curbside leaf collections this fall. The first pick up will be on Saturday, November 18th and the second one will be on Saturday December 2nd. These collections are for bagged leaves only, and brush will not be picked up. Leaves must be placed in recyclable bags. Loose piles and plastic bags will not be picked up.

The Service Department continues to work in cooperation with our neighboring communities to provide assistance as needed, and also request assistance when needed. We are thankful for the help we receive from the City of Mentor, City of Painesville, Fairport Harbor, Grand River Village, Concord Township and Perry Township. By sharing equipment and services we are able to reduce costs and offer a benefit to all our residents.

The Service Department continues to trim and cut back roadside trees and brush as needed to reduce sight restrictions throughout the Township. While the Township cannot go on to private property to cut trees and brush, we are permitted to provide this service in the road right-of-way. If you see a corner where visibility is limited due to trees or brush, please let the Service Department know by calling 440-352-2661.

There are two road resurfacing projects beginning in August. North Ridge Road (US Route 20) will be paved during the month of August. North Ridge Road is maintained by the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT). Work is expected to be completed by August 31. Through traffic will be maintained.

Hardy Road will be paved beginning in mid-August. Hardy Road is maintained by the Lake County Engineer's Office. Work will be completed by September 31. Through traffic will be maintained.

development will have one access road from Blasé-Nemeth Road, and one access road from Bacon Road. The developer is constructing several detention basins that are required by the Lake County Engineer's Office, at their own expense. In a separate project, Painesville Township will build a regional detention pond that will help alleviate existing storm water drainage issues in the northeast section of the Township. The Trustees negotiated with Ryan Homes to have 11 acres set aside to build the regional detention pond. These 11 acres have been set aside for the Township to use in the form of an easement, at no cost to Painesville Township. Funding for building the regional detention pond has not been established yet.

The pier being built out into Lake Erie at Painesville Township Park is getting closer to completion. Lake Metroparks is building a handicap-accessible pier that will provide rare access to the lake. This beautiful pier will extend out into Lake Erie by 200 feet. It will be a great location for fishing, sunset and star gazing. The opening of the pier is expected during the month of September.

Two of the largest employers in Painesville Township have expanded their facilities and increased employment in the past year.

Avery Dennison has just completed a 70,000 square foot expansion at their Hardy Road plant. They will expand their product line here, and bring some of their processes and jobs from Indiana.

Lubrizol Corporation has just completed the construction of a 100,000 square foot building and will also bring some processes and jobs from out of state.

T and T Machine Inc. recently moved to a much larger facility on Callendar Blvd. and expanded operations.
