The Trustees had the privilege of honoring two Township residents recently. In April the Trustees passed a Resolution honoring Luke Peterson for his heroic efforts to apply the Heimlich maneuver to save his best friend from choking on food. Luke, who is a fifth grader at Buckeye Elementary School, was honored for his quick thinking and action in an emergency situation.

In May the Trustees passed a Resolution honoring Thomas Jones for providing protection to a mother and her two young children from a home invader. In fact, Mr. Jones stopped the intruder from following this young family into his own house. Mr. Jones, who is a lifelong Township resident, was honored for his bravery and disregard for his own safety when rendering assistance to a family in danger.

## ROAD SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The brush, leaf and yard waste drop off area is open on Saturdays from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm and on Wednesdays from 7:30 am until 3:00 pm. This service is for Painesville Township residents only. Yard service contractors and residents from other communities are not permitted. Employees from the Service Department will be there to assist you.

### Looking Ahead

During the month of November only, the brush and leaf drop off area will open Monday through Friday from 7:00 am until 3:00 pm, and also on Saturdays from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm.

The Service Department once again will provide two curbside leaf collections during the fall:

Saturday, November 17th

Saturday, December 1st

This free service is provided to residential households to make it easy to dispose of leaves. The Township partners with different clubs and sports teams from Riverside High School to get all of the leaves picked up in one day! Students provide extra labor, and earn \$1,000.00 for their club / team.

The Township applies for a grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission each year to help get funding to pave and repair roads. This grant pays for approximately one half of the cost of our annual road improvement program. This year we have paved Dorchester Drive, Bristol Avenue, and Morgan Drive South. We have reconstructed Castleman Court, Bayberry Court East, Fanwood Drive, Appletree Drive, Heatherstone Drive, and Temple Avenue. It cost \$764,239 to pave 1.6 miles of roads in 2018. During the last six years we have spent \$2,889,701 to pave 9.4 miles of roads in the Township.

Did you know? There are 90.5 miles of roads in Painesville Township. The Township Service Department is responsible for most, but not all of the roads. The Township has legal responsibility for the maintenance, repair and plowing of 51.43 miles of our roads. The Lake County Engineer's Office is responsible for 18.52 miles of roads, many of which are the most traveled roads in the Township. The Ohio Department of Transportation maintains 20.55 miles of roadway including US Route 20, and State Routes 84 and 535. For a list of the roads that the County and State are responsible for please see the Service Department tab on our website. In addition to road maintenance, the Service Department also maintains and repairs storm water drainage infrastructure. This typically means storm

sewers, drainage basins, culverts, and certain drainage ditches.

Once again our snowplows have been dressed up and painted by the Riverside High School Art Department. The students create their own designs for each plow. We had them on display in both the Fairport Mardis Gras Parade and the Lake County Fair Parade.

The Service Department cuts a lot of grass! We maintain the grounds at all three Fire Stations, Town Hall, the Service Garage, the Blish Cemetery, Crislip Park, and the many islands and open spaces throughout the Township. Additionally, when property owners neglect to cut the grass on their property we cut the grass there also. We then place a bill for the work on the property owner's tax duplicate.

All curbed roads in Painesville Township will be swept this summer through an agreement with the Lake County Stormwater Department and the Lake County Engineer's Office.

Please blow grass clippings off the roadway and sidewalk back into the lawn. Grass clippings left on roads and sidewalks may be washed into the storm sewer system leading to backups and flooding. Grass clippings in the road also present a safety hazard for bicyclists and motorcycles. This good neighbor policy helps keep all of our neighborhoods safe, looking good, and free from storm sewer backups.



## FIRE DEPARTMENT

On May 14th the Painesville Township Fire Department conducted a swearing in ceremony for two newly hired full-time firefighters and promoted two firefighters to lieutenant.

Firefighters Nick Hribar and Dan Stech began their full time assignments on the week of April 30th, 2018 and were officially sworn in by Fire Chief Frank Huffman at the ceremony at Painesville Township Station 3 on May 14th.

The hiring process for these new firefighters was nearly a year in the making as Trustee Chuck Hillier and Chief Frank Huffman began planning in June 2017, with a committee composed department members; Lieutenant Gordon Thompson, Lieutenant Art Lagerstedt, Lieutenant Ryan Skully, firefighter Clint Buchanan and firefighter John Mihic helped to work out the study materials and outline the process for the evaluation of the full-time candidates.

The evaluation process was very competitive and involved a written test. This written exam was based on three fire related text books, and Lake Health Paramedic Protocols. In addition to the written

test the candidates went through a peer review process with the officers in the department as well an interview with the Fire Chief.

In addition to hiring two new full-time firefighters, the Painesville Township Fire Department also promoted two fire lieutenants. Shawn Forster and Tony Iliano took the lieutenant's oath as the newly promoted officers.

Lieutenants Forster and Iliano finished in the top positions after a rigorous promotional process. The process required each candidate to study five fire department related text books during a six week period. The candidates were given a written test based on the study materials. After passing the written test, the candidates moved on to an interview process which evaluated their past performance and tested their abilities using situational and scenario based questions. The last and final step of the process was a psychological profile administered by an independent testing company. The new officers received their shift assignments on the week of April 30th, 2018 and officially took the Lieutenant's Oath at the ceremony at Painesville Township Station 3 on May 14th.
