On May 16, the Trustees held their meeting at Fire Station #3 on Hardy Road. Several residents came to the meeting to request information and / or assistance from the Township. The next meeting at a different location away from Township Hall will be held at the Riverside Local School District Board Office. The meeting will be held on Tuesday, October 17, at 7:30 p.m.

Please be aware that the station may be unoccupied when the department is called out for an emergency.




The Township applied for a grant several years ago to build glass-enclosed bus shelters along Mentor Avenue for residents waiting for a Laketran bus. At the Trustees meeting on May 16 the Trustees awarded the construction contract to Eclipse Co. LLC in Chagrin Falls. This summer Eclipse Co. will build five bus shelter pads with solar lighting. Once the base pads are built, Laketran will construct the shelters. The bus shelters will be a great amenity for people using Laketran.

One of the common complaints that we receive at Township Hall is that a drainage ditch is not functioning properly and is flooding into people's yards. Please be aware that the Township does not maintain or clean most of the ditches in the Township. Ditch maintenance is the responsibility of the property owner. Please clean your ditch periodically by removing trash, branches, brush, and growth in the bottom

# FIRE DEPARTMENT



The Opiate Epidemic: Painesville Township is not immune to the national trend in the increase in the abuse of opiate drugs. The chart below presents the startling increase in Opiate related overdoses 2003 to 2015. Opiates are a family of drugs that is originaly derived from Poppy flowers, the drugs are used for pain control. Drugs like morphine, opium and heroin are some of the drugs made from the poppy plant. Heroin was never a legal drug to be used in medical practice. Drugs that a manufactured in the Opiate family are hydrocodone and oxycodone. We are seeing the increase in the use heroin in turn an significant increase in accidental overdoses and death. Opiate overdoses are treated with a drug called Naloxone (Narcan), this drug reverses the narcotic effects of the opiates. The chart below represents the number of doses of Narcan we have given over the last 4 years.




We are working with several agencies to educate the public to the problem and how to get help to the people that need assistance. It is not all drug addicts that die; sometimes the single use of a tainted heroin dose kills the user. Kids are known to experiment with drugs, experimenting with heroin might be the last thing they do on this earth. We need to get the word out how dangerous and deadly this drug is, and that

there is help available for both the user and their family. The Lake County ADAMHS Board and the Lake County General Health District are two agencies that offer help.



Lt. Tom Sitz was an instructor at the Fire Department Instructor Conference held in Indianapolis. This is the sixth time Lt. Sitz has presented at the largest firefighting training conference in the United States.

Lt. Gordon Thompson and Painesville Township's own K-9 Arson Dog, Ian, were dispatched to San Juan, Puerto Rico to assist in an arson investigation for the Federal Government. Ian is one of only 54 K-9 Arson dogs certified by The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) in the country. During their two-day investigation lan was able to assist local and Federal authorities in collecting evidence that will be used at the accused person's trial. The costs for lan, his training, and for traveling to an investigation are paid for by the Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives Agency. Painesville Township is fortunate to have a specially trained K-9 Arson Dog. Ian has been used to investigate suspicious fires throughout Northeast Ohio. In addition, Ian makes frequent appearances at local community events as he is very friendly and gentle with children.

half of the ditch. Vegetation growing in the upper half of the ditch is healthy and prevents erosion. It is critical that residents do not dump grass clippings and yard waste into a ditch. Do not build bridges across a ditch. This blocks the flow of water and causes flooding.

The Zoning Department will welcome Harley DeLeon back as a part-time zoning inspector on June 12. Harley was the part-time Zoning Inspector in 2016, until she and her family moved out of state. Harley returns to the Township just as Lorrie Schuck retires. Lorrie will stay with the Township as

the secretary to the Zoning Commission and the Board of Zoning Appeals.

Did you know? Helen Hazen Wyman Park is located in both Painesville Township and Concord Township. This park was the first park in the LakeMetroparks system. LakeMetroparks was formed in 1958.
