ROAD SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The brush, leaf and yard waste drop off area will reopen Wednesday April 4th. The drop off site will be open on Saturdays from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm and on Wednesdays from 7:30 am until 3:00 pm. A member of the Service Department will be there to assist residents.

2017 was a very busy year for the Service Department and the residents that we serve. Over 5,500 residents were served at the drop off site resulting in 202 loads of brush and 131 loads of leaves hauled away. Our crews also collected 170 Christmas trees in January. This natural debris is taken to local nurseries to be recycled.

The annual curbside brush collection will be held on Monday June 4th, 2018. All brush must be tied in bundles not exceeding four feet in length and placed at the curb by 7:30 am on June 4th.

Information on the brush drop area and curbside collections is available on our website at www.painesvilletwp.com. Click the Departments tab, and then click the Service Department tab.

The Painesville Township Road Department is responsible for plowing and salting 206 total roads, over 50 miles of roads, and 8 miles of sidewalks every time it snows. Included in this total we have: 89 cul de sacs, 5 half cul de sacs, and 35 dead end streets.

We deploy seven large dump trucks and 2 one-ton dump trucks to plow the streets and we are able to have all roads salted and plowed in 4 hours time. Hills are typically treated twice in 4 hours. On many days the trucks return to the garage to re-load and go back around again. Our priority is clearing the roads. The sidewalks are not plowed until the roads are safe.

During the period from December 12, 2017 through

February 12, 2018 the following materials were used to clear the roads:

1,398 tons of salt # 3,600 gallons of salt brine # 720 gallons of beet juice

1,025 gallons of unleaded gas // 4,775 gallons of diesel fuel // drove 25,200 miles

We salted and/or plowed on 34 days out of 63, making 85 rounds throughout the Township.

The bridge on Newell Street that passes over Route 2 will be closed for 180 days beginning on April 20 for repairs. Did you know? Some sections of Newell Street are in Painesville Township and some sections of Newell Street are in the City of Painesville. The borders between the City and the Township are not in a straight line on this road. 1/3rd of the Newell Street bridge is in the Township and 2/3rds of the bridge is in the City.

The commercial / retail section of Mentor Avenue continues to grow and add businesses. A frequent question is can a traffic light be installed where Mill Morr Road intersects with Mentor Avenue. U S Route 20 (Mentor Avenue) is a state road that is controlled by ODOT. The Trustees have asked ODOT twice in the last four years to install a traffic light at this location. Each time ODOT has conducted a traffic study and determined that the volume of traffic, and the other criteria they consider, does not meet their minimum requirements for a traffic light. The Trustees will continue to monitor the traffic volume here and look for alternatives to make this section of road safer.

In addition to being home for almost 17,000 residents, Painesville Township is home for a wide variety of animal

life. Some are good for us, some are annoying, and some make us concerned. Occasionally coyotes are spotted in the Township. Please understand that coyotes are common throughout Ohio, both in urban and rural counties. A great website to learn about coyotes and how to deal with them is on the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) website.
