Present: Trustees Gabe Cicconetti, Chuck Hillier, Josh Pennock, Administrator Michael Manary, Legal Advisor Michael Lucas, Fiscal Officer Michael Patriarca.

Various topics, agenda items and departmental matters were brought before the board including the approval of minutes from the previous meeting March 5, 2019.

SUMMARY OF WORK SESSION:

Administrator Manary summarized the work session noting the following:

- The Trustees went in to Executive Session to discuss pending litigation and to discuss negotiations with another political sub division for economic development assistance.
- The Trustees discussed amending the parking resolution that applies to the Township.
- The Trustees discussed odors at the County Landfill and the public meeting that will be held on April 3rd at 6:30 at the Community Center at Painesville Township Park in coordination with County Commissioner Jerry Cirino and the Lake County Solid Waste District.
- The Trustees spent some time reviewing the parade that we held on Sunday and how it was an arousing success.
- The Fire Chief discussed training for his department. He discussed a couple of issues with Fire Department vehicles. The Chief talked about using Facebook to promote a message for the Fire Department. He gave an update on some grants that he has applied for.
- The Service Director discussed the potential of having a student from Riverside doing a senior project with the Service Department. He discussed a grant application that he submitted to Otarma. He talked about selling truck # 11 on govdeals website for selling government property. He also discussed the Township roads resurfacing project this summer.

NEW BUSINESS: Resident of the Township that lives on Pebble Beach Cove wanted to discuss the Parking Ban. John Muzik wanted to thank the Sheriff's Department for enforcing the speed limit on twenty. He has noticed a big difference.

2019-041 RESOLUTION DECLARING APRIL CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH IN PAINESVILLE TOWNSHIP

Whereas, all children of our community have the right to live and grow in a safe, secure and supportive environment; enter school prepared to succeed; be able to choose healthy behaviors and grow to successful adulthood, and

Whereas, we the leaders of this community acknowledge that those rights are not always available to all of the children and although there has been significant progress to increase the safety and security of our children, we renew our commitment to protecting our most valuable resource, and

Whereas, Lake County Children Services responded to 2,365 calls regarding children and their families and as a result, on any given day, Children Services worked with over 1,000 children who presented with a variety of problems which could not be easily resolved. Over 100 foster families, adoptive families, relatives and other alternative caregivers provided a safe environment for children who were unable to be in their family home, and

Whereas, statistics show that a great majority of children who died from child maltreatment in the state of Ohio were under the age of five years old, never having the chance to attend kindergarten, and survivors of child abuse and neglect are at a greater risk for problems later in life that affect not just the child and family but our society as a whole, and

Whereas, the best prevention of child abuse can only be done if we, both as a society and as individuals, take responsibility to offer parents and families the support and tools they need to provide healthy nurturing homes for their children,

Therefore, we shall declare April as Child Abuse Prevention Month in Painesville Township and urge the citizens of our community to join with us to become involved in activities this month and

all through the year to raise the awareness of child abuse and to focus our attention on providing safe environments for children and fostering confident, positive parents.

2019-040 RESOLUTION THAT PAINESVILLE TOWNSHIP WILL PICK UP THE STATUTORILY REQUIRED EMPLOYEE CONTRIBUTION TO THE OHIO PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF THE PAINESVILLE TOWNSHIP PURSUANT TO INTERNAL REVENUE CODE SECTION 414(h)(2)

WHEREAS, pursuant to federal and Ohio laws, the federal and state income taxes on a portion of the wages or salaries of the employees of the Painesville Township will be deferred if Painesville Township "picks up" (assumes and pays) the contributions statutorily required to be made by such elected officials and covered employees to Ohio Public Employees Retirement System (OPERS); AND

Whereas, Painesville Township will not incur any additional costs in the picking up of such contributions

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY PAINESVILLE TOWNSHIP OHIO THAT:

Section 1: Effective March 1, 2019, the full amount of the statutorily required employee contributions to OPERS shall be withheld from the gross pay of each person within any of the classes established in Section 2 herein and shall be "picked up" (assumed and paid to OPERS) by Painesville Township. This "pick up" by Painesville Township shall be designated as public employee contributions and shall be in lieu of contributions to OPERS by each person within any of the classes established in Section 2 herein. No person subject to this "pick up" shall have the option of choosing to receive the statutorily required contribution to OPERS directly instead of having it "picked up" by Painesville Township or of being excluded from the "pick up" Painesville Township shall, in reporting and making remittance to OPERS, report that the public employee contribution for each person subject to this "pick up" has been made as provided by the statute. Therefore, contributions, although designated as employee contributions, are employer-paid, and employees do not have the option to receive the contributions directly. All contributions are paid by the employer directly to the plan.

Section 2: The "pick up" by Painesville Township provided by this ordinance shall apply only to the following classes, Office Manager; Service Director, Road Forman, Road Labor 1 and Assistant Service Director of Painesville Township who are or become contributing members of OPERS

Section 3: The Painesville Township method of payment of salary to employees who are participants in OPERS is hereby modified as provided in Section 4, in order to provide for a salary reduction pick up of employee contributions to OPERS

Section 4: The total salary for each employee shall be the salary otherwise payable under Painesville Township policies. Such total salary of each employee shall be payable by Painesville Township in two parts: (a) deferred salary and (b) cash salary. An employee's deferred salary shall be equal to that percentage of that employee's total salary which is required from time to time by OPERS to be paid as an employee contribution by that employee, and shall be paid by Painesville Township to OPERS on behalf of that employee as a pick up and in lieu of the OPERS employee contribution otherwise payable by that employee. An employee's cash salary shall be equal to that employee's total salary less the amount of the pick up for that employee, and shall be payable, subject to applicable payroll deductions, to that employee. Painesville Township shall compute and remit its employer contributions to OPERS based upon an employee's total salary. The total combined expenditures of Painesville Township for such employees total salaries payable under applicable Painesville Township policies and the pick-up provisions of this

resolution shall not be greater than the amounts it would have paid for those items had this provision not been in effect.

Section 5: The clerk are hereby authorized and directed to implement the provisions of this ordinance to institute the "pick up" of the statutorily required contributions to OPERS for those persons reflected in Section 2 herein so as to enable them to obtain the result in federal and state tax deferments.
